HISTORICAL PRIDE



Pride in a Rich History A Driving Force for a New Era

While educating professionals who contribute to the region, CNU has also stood as a symbol of intellect in action, playing a pivotal role in Korea's democratic development. The legacy of the May 18 Democratization Movement, which resisted dictatorship and helped advance democracy, remains a source of pride for the university and a driving force for its future.

1909 – 1952 The Birth and Foundations of Chonnam National University

- 1909. Gwangju Agriculture School, the predecessor of CNU's College of Agriculture, was established.
- 1944. Gwangju Professional Medical School, the predecessor of CNU's College of Medicine, was established.
- October 1951. Approval was granted for the establishment of Chonnam National University.
- January 1952. Chonnam National University was formally inaugurated with five founding colleges: Engineering, Agriculture, Liberal Arts and Sciences, Commerce, and Medicine.

1953 – 1979 Quantitative Growth and Qualitative Advancement in Specialized Education and Research

- 1954. CNU reinforced the comprehensive university system by newly establishing the graduate school and the School of Law.
- 1955. New university headquarters and major lecture buildings were constructed at the present-day Yongbong Campus.
- 1971. The College of Education was established to train professional educators.
- 1978. CNU modernized Chonnam National University Hospital and expanded its role as a regional medical hub.

1980 – 1999 Hub of the Democratization Movement and Growth into a Flagship Regional University

- 1980. As a birthplace of the May 18 Democratization Movement, CNU played a pivotal role in the development of democracy in Korea.
- 1981. CNU newly established the College of Dentistry and expanded and reorganized the university into an 11-college system.
- 1988. CNU newly established the College of Veterinary Medicine and laid the foundation for advanced research in fundamental academic fields.
- 1996. CNU ranked among the top in research capacity evaluations as a flagship regional university.

2000 – 2026 Selection for the Glocal University Initiative and AI-Based Education for the Future

- 2006. CNU was integrated with Yeosu National University, establishing the Yeosu Campus and strengthening its specialization in marine and fisheries fields.
- 2009. CNU Law School opened, strengthening the university's system of professional legal education.
- 2019. The College of AI Convergence was established, marking the full-scale introduction of AI-focused curricula.
- 2025. CNU was selected for the Glocal University 30 initiative, accelerating its transformation into a globally competitive university rooted in the region.

Present As a leading university in AI, CNU focuses on nurturing creative talent through Human-centered AI (HAI).

CNU nurtures “students who can make the most effective use of AI in their own fields, even without majoring in AI.” All students complete foundational general education courses in AI so that every student acquires AI literacy, and grow into future AI talent through basic and advanced AI convergence programs and integrated bachelor’s-to-doctoral pathways.

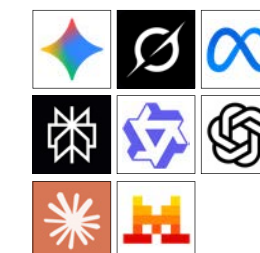
- Build a tiered curriculum spanning foundational AI literacy, advanced disciplinary study, and AI+X convergence

- At the Bitgreen Industry-Academia Convergence Campus, CNU and its industry partners conduct joint research, education, and technology demonstration.

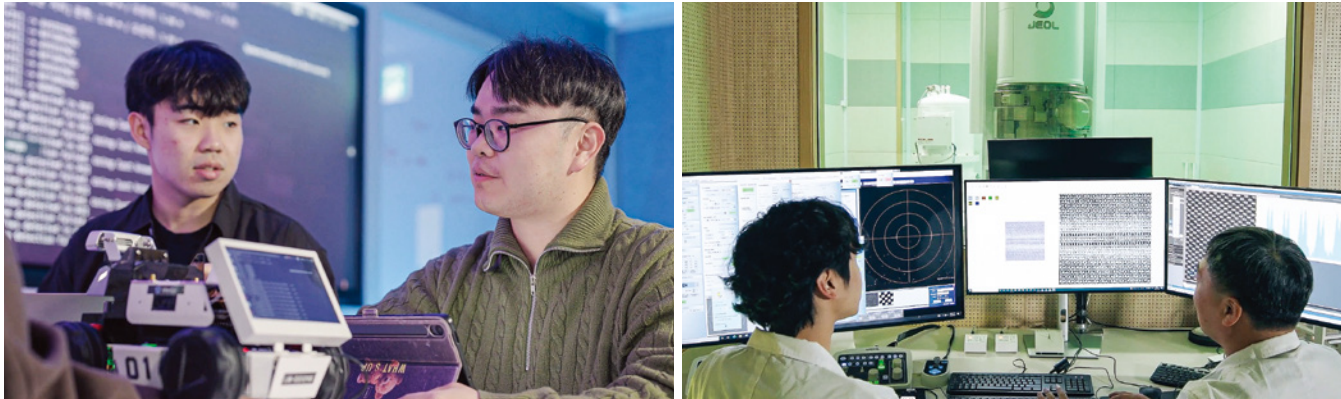
AI Convergence Education Pathways

AI Literacy Required general education courses in AI fundamentals and Python programming for all first-year students

Discipline-Specific AI Education Short, intensive AI programs combining students’ majors with self-designed modules

Convergence Major & Multiple Majors A “convergence major” degree in which AI and one’s main major are studied at a 1:1 ratio





Modular Curricula that Nurture Creativity

Through “personalized, self-directed” modular curricula, disciplinary knowledge is organized into smaller learning units, allowing students to choose modules across fields and develop into creative, interdisciplinary thinkers.

Microdegree
Students who complete a specialized set of courses receive a certificate issued by the President of CNU.

Greater Freedom in Choosing Majors and Interdisciplinary Programs
By lowering barriers between departments, CNU allows students to take modules outside their primary fields of study.

Flexible Academic Term System
Intensive course formats allow students to complete selected modules over a shorter period.

International Internship

CNU provides support for airfare and living expenses, enabling students to gain hands-on experience at global companies, public institutions, and research institutes abroad.

Oman Gihaeng (Student-Led Global Exploration Program)

In this self-directed program, students select a theme and destination, explore leading practices abroad, and bring their findings back.

Talents Who Learn and Grow in a Global Environment

CNU has signed academic exchange agreements with 667 institutions (universities and research institutes) in 69 countries worldwide, helping students and researchers grow on the global stage.

Building a Global Campus Environment

CNU operates international exchange summer schools and programs connecting Korean and international students, helping them develop intercultural awareness and build communication networks in everyday campus life. CNU Selected as the Only University in Jeonnam-Gwangju Special Metropolitan City for the K-STAR Visa Track. Under this program, outstanding international students who earn a master’s or doctoral degree in a STEM field may obtain F-2 resident status upon the recommendation of the CNU President, even without a job offer. The program also provides an expedited pathway to permanent residency.

Dual Degree

Students obtain two degrees by fulfilling the degree requirements of both universities.
(e.g., a CNU bachelor’s degree + an overseas university bachelor’s degree)

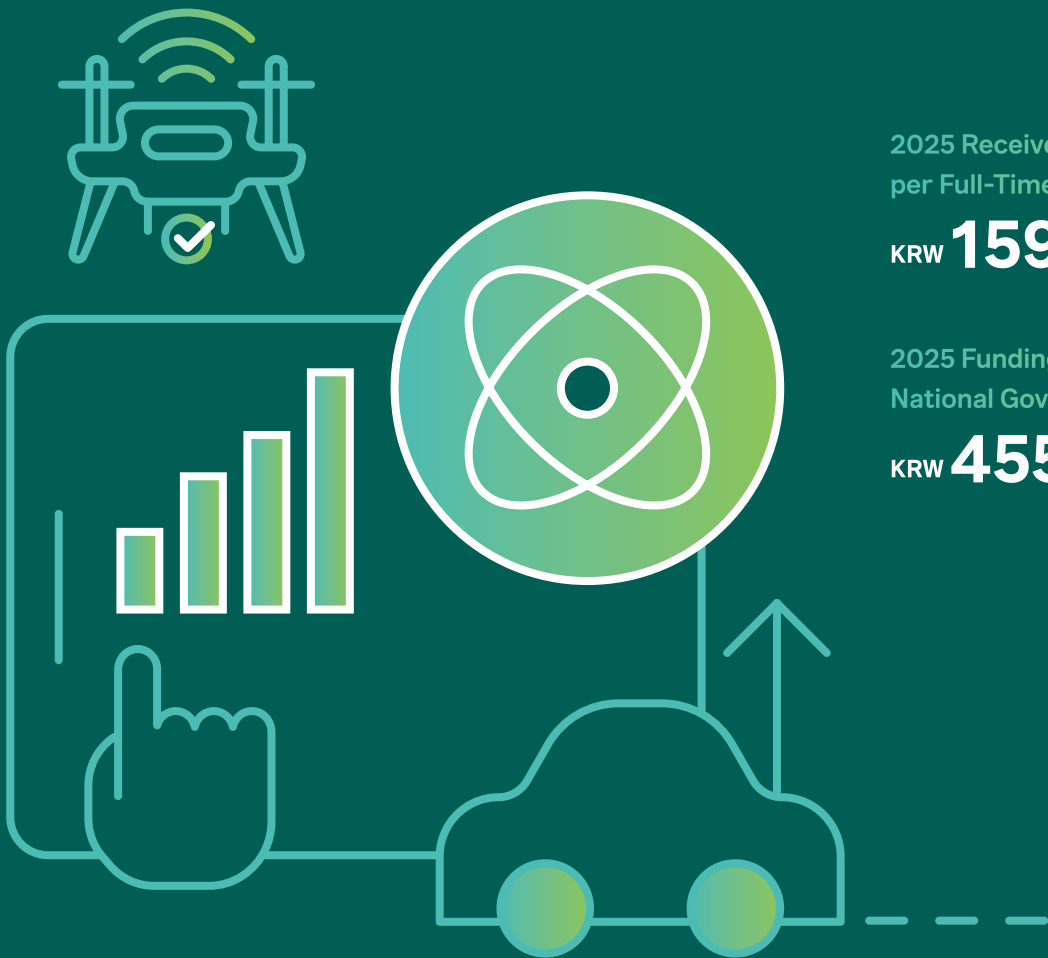
Engagement with International Students With more than 2,000 international students on campus, CNU encourages language and cultural exchange through programs such as International Exchange Day and the Buddy Program.

A Globally Competitive Research University

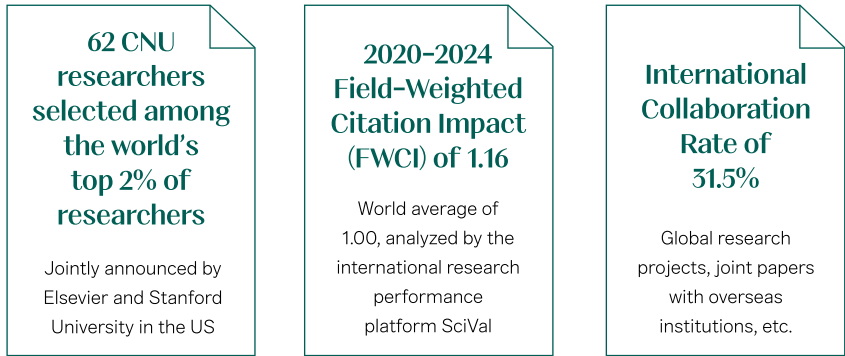
CNU is a globally competitive research university with strengths in AI, medicine, engineering, the humanities, and many other fields. The University provides robust support for faculty research and has a strong track record of securing research funding. In 2023, CNU secured KRW 220.1 billion in research funding—the highest total among Korea’s flagship national universities for the second year in a row. This funding supports work across the academic spectrum, from foundational research to cutting-edge technologies.

Developing Globally Competitive Research Fields

CNU is investing strategically in globally competitive research in AI, future mobility, and cultural content, with the goal of ranking among the world’s top 50 in selected fields. It is also establishing an “Institute for AI Convergence Research” to serve as a hub for collaboration among regional government-industry-academia-research institutions and to build a sustainable research ecosystem.

Future-Oriented Innovative Research Outcomes

CNU conducts diverse large research projects that will lead the future of humanity and innovative change in Korean society. Across government-funded research, regional projects, industry collaboration, and interdisciplinary studies, CNU continues to identify new research questions and demonstrate its capabilities through high-quality outcomes.

Next-Generation Integrated Research Support System (C-RAMS+U)

Through C-RAMS+U, its intelligent, data-driven research support platform, CNU provides tailored support for individual researchers. CNU provides systematic, tailored support for researchers at every stage of their careers. CNU creates an environment in which graduate students and postdoctoral researchers can focus on their research and supports their academic development through programs including BK21 and Philosophoi.

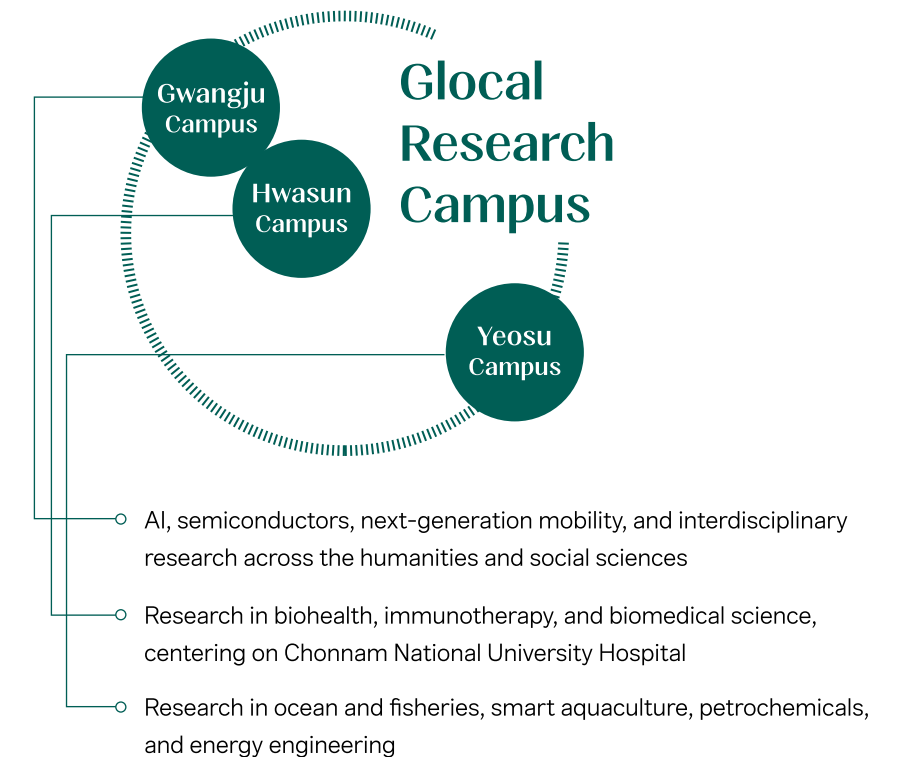
An Innovation Hub Realizing the Regional Industrial Vision

As a leading think tank and innovation hub, CNU is helping Gwangju become Korea's AI capital. The University supports four strategic industries: cultural content, future mobility, energy, and AI and semiconductors. It develops industry strategies and conducts applied research and technology validation to drive AI-powered transformation. Key research areas include ultra-low-power semiconductor design and the testing of autonomous vehicle components.

CNU Campus Innovation Park and the Gwangju AI Startup Valley

CNU is helping energize the regional industrial ecosystem by building the "Gwangju-style Pangyo Techno Valley," linking Gwangju Station, CNU, and the Gwangju High-Tech Industrial Complex. Based at the CNU Campus Innovation Park, CNU leads the establishment of a startup base linked with the Gwangju Station Startup Valley and builds a network for demonstration-linked startup support within the cutting-edge industrial complex.

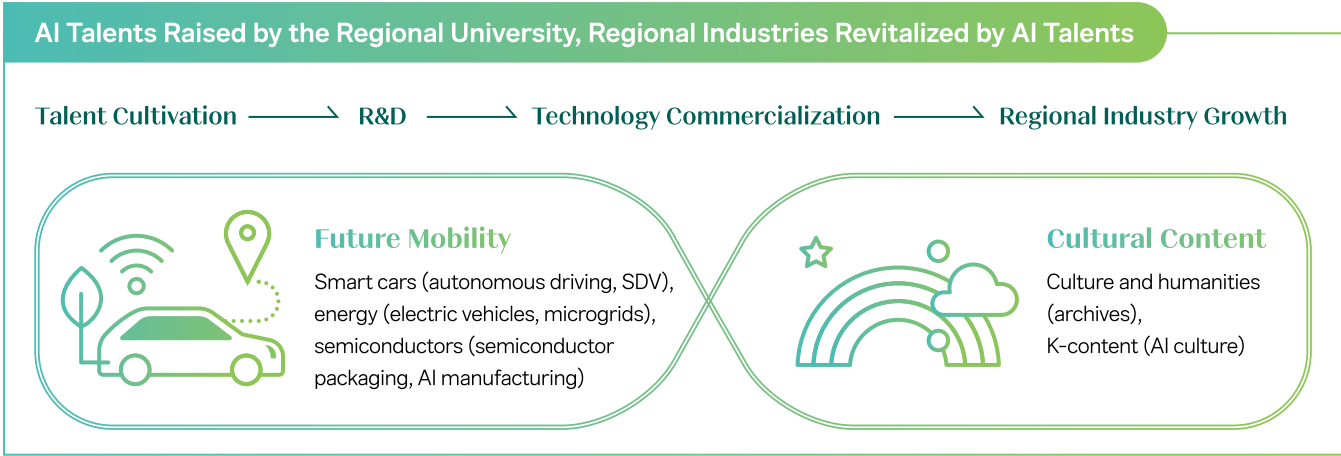


University-Industry Campuses Designed to Meet Industry Needs

The Gwangju Bitgreen and Yeosu University-Industry Campuses provide education tailored to the needs of local industries. At the Bitgreen Campus, faculty and students in the Department of Intelligent Mobility Convergence integrate hands-on, R&D-based education with collaborative research conducted in partnership with industry. The Yeosu Campus offers customized degree programs in partnership with companies to prepare skilled professionals for Jeonnam’s industries and help local employers address workforce shortages.

Developing Talent in Partnership with Leading Global Companies

CNU partners with leading global companies in advanced industries, including semiconductors and AI, to develop talent with the skills employers need. Through an agreement with LG Innotek, the University provides industry-aligned education linked to employment opportunities. CNU has also partnered with Amkor to establish the CNU-Amkor Joint Research Center for Semiconductor Packaging Technology. The center brings together local government, CNU, Amkor, and research institutions to advance semiconductor packaging research and workforce development.

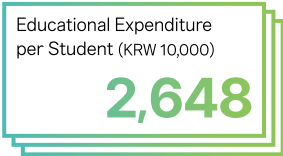
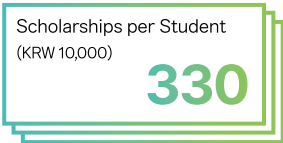
CNU actively supports student-led festivals, clubs, and academic activities, recognizing that student initiative and creativity enrich campus life and strengthen the University community.

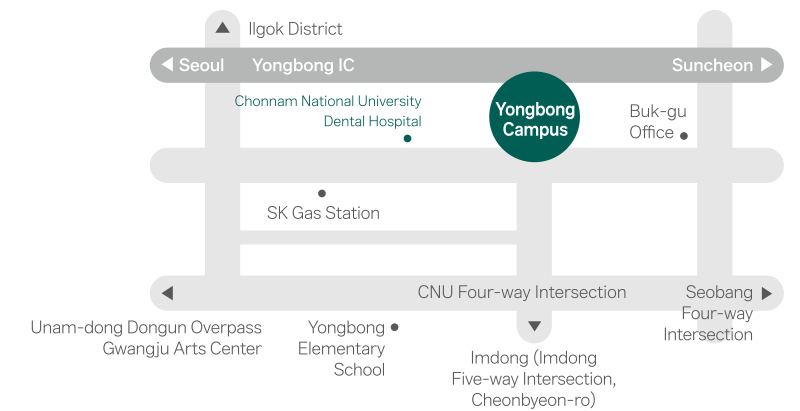

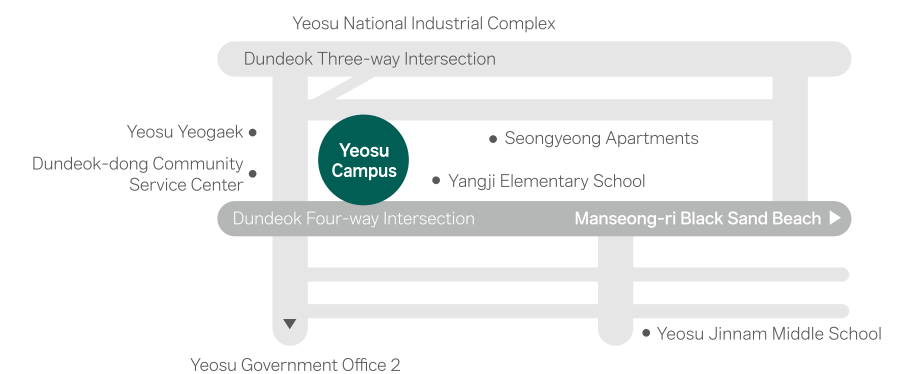
